Summary of My Activities and Future Plans

My academic and professional career has primarily centered on two areas – health and end-of-life care and instructing public health and geriatric nursing to nursing students. Previously, I worked as a primary care nurse practitioner and gained considerable experience with palliative and geriatric care.

My research focuses on aspects of aging health, home care, palliative care, ethics of care and public health in a multicultural society. In recent years, I have examined palliative care and its influence on primary caregivers, such as family members. I have investigated the effect of caregiving and emotional labor on burden and depression levels, and the influence of social support, social interaction and feeling rules as a source of strength and coping with caregiving burden in Israeli society.

I have collaborated with other researchers, including a leading HMO geriatric department head, with whom I continue to investigate family caregivers' struggles. We also study the COVID-19 pandemic's impact on older adults, particularly those with dementia.

I have also formed research partnerships with medical ethics scholars to explore dilemmas and moral challenges facing family caregivers and professional staff. Another collaboration is with a social anthropologist and action researcher focused on women's caregiving experiences in Israeli society.

These research areas also inform my teaching of nursing students. I teach public health, primary care nursing and community services, as well as recent developments in home care, palliative care and person-centered multi-cultural care, with the aim of empowering care recipients. I also research and teach geriatric nursing, focusing on aging in place, and preserving the elderly's independence and quality of life.

Currently, I continue investigating family caregivers of people with dementia in Israel. I am also interested in ethical aging issues, particularly with dementia, and the pandemic's impact on Israelis with dementia. My work also examines patient and professional gender dynamics in palliative care units.

During my tenure at the college, I played a vital role in the administration of clinical training for nursing students. This involved instructing students and guiding clinical instructors in both simulation and clinical settings, emphasizing the development of critical clinical thinking, ethical professionalism, empathetic skills, and the ability to engage with academic research.
